INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

Journal Metallurgical & Materials Engineering publishes:

- *scientific papers* (up to 10 typed pages with double spacing including figures and tables), which contain the results of original investigations, presented so that the experiments can be reproduced and the analyzed and conclusions verified;
- *preliminary communications* (up to 4 pages), which contain results the character of which requires urgent publication; do not necessarily have to contain documentation required for complete verification of the results;
- *review papers* (up to 15 pages), which give a complete presentation and analysis of a certain field or problem on the basis of previously published material; previous consultation with the editor is required;
- *professional papers* (up to 10 pages), not related to original investigations, useful also in the sense of extending knowledge and adapting investigations to practical needs.

The classification of the submitted paper is suggested by the author and is finally accepted by the editorial board on the basis of the referee's report.

Papers are published in English.

The manuscripts should be submitted preferably by e-mail to Technical Editor:

The organization of the manuscript should be as follows:

title, which concisely denotes the contents of the paper;

- *first and last names* of all the authors with affiliations and e-mail of corresponding author;
- *abstract* of no more than 200 words which should concisely present the major results of the paper;
- keywords 3-5 separated with commas (,);
- *text of a scientific or professional paper* should contain a short introduction, experimental work, results, discussion and conclusion including figures and tables.
- *tables* should be numbered consecutively with Arabic numerals. Each table should be given a descriptive caption. The tables should be planned so as their final widths do not exceed 12 cm. Tables should be embedded in the text.
- *figures and graphs* should be numbered with Arabic numerals, have descriptive captions, and be embedded in the text. Minimum resolution of figures should be 600dpi, with maximum width of 8cm. Graphs should be prepared using appropriable program packages with axes clearly visible.

equations should be denoted by Arabic numbers in parentheses.

References in the text should be denoted by Arabic numerals in square brackets. The list of references should follow the main text and should have the following format:
